
# LABOR CHARACTERISTICS SCIENCE RELATED OCCUPATIONS


#### AN ESTIMATED TOTAL OF 15,010 PEOPLE IN THE LABORSHED AREA

#### **ESTIMATED TOTAL BY EMPLOYMENT STATUS (PERCENTAGE):**






